Two Types of Dry Eyes

ry eye doesn't mean that people can't weep. Dry eye is a disorder related with quality of tears and not the quantity of tears. The two predominant types of dry eye are the aqueous deficient (which is relatively rare) and more common the lipid deficient, accounting for vast majority of dry eye. Aqueous deficient dry eye occurs when the tear glands do not secrete enough tears to keep the eyes sufficiently moist. Lipid deficient dry eye, also known as evaporative dry eye, occurs when the tears evaporates at a faster rate than normal due to an inadequate protective lipid (oil) layer on the surface of the tear film. Oils are produced by Meibomian Glands in the lids. Missing of these oily layers is the reason behind MGD. LipiFlow has major role in treatment of MGD. Evaporative dry eye is the most prevalent type affecting up to 86% of dry eye sufferers.

Dry Eye Symptoms and Identifying MGD

f you are experiencing burning and redness, ocular fatigue, foreign body sensation, sensitivity to light, excessive tearing, symptoms worsen later in the day, transient



blurring and contact lens intolerance, you may be suffering from MGD or Dry Eyes. In all cases of dry eyes, it is important to test for MGD to direct treatment appropriately. These tests help us to better understand the meibomian function and structure. Dry eye workup is needed to identify the cause and direct the treatment for aqueous



deficient dry eye, MGD and ocular allergy. Dry eye sufferers experience great discomfort and are desperately seeking new approach as in addition to traditional therapies, which only provide limited symptomatic relief.

Its contoured design vaults the cornea and protects the eye allowing a maximum therapeutic temperature of 43 degrees Celsius to reach glands from the inner eyelid, without damaging the eyelid or delicate structures of the globe. Space-age insulation protects the cornea from exceeding a safe 39.5 degrees Celsius, while an intelligent pressure feedback loop sends pulsed sequences to expel blockages. Force equalization protects the globe from pressure transmission by focusing energy only on the eyelid. •

Dry Eyes is also Associated with Computer Vision Syndrome



he link between computer use and dry eye disease is probably not coincidental, since people who use these devices blink at a rate that is one-third less than normal, and we know that blinking and lubricating of the surface is important to prevent dryness.

The blink reflex is one of the fastest reflexes in the body and is present at birth. However, our blink rate varies with different activities. Research has shown that the blink rate of electronic display workers dropped very significantly during work at a electronic display compared to before and after work. Possible explanations for the decreased blink rate include concentration on the task or a relatively limited range of eye movements. The amount of evaporation roughly relates to eye opening. The higher gaze angle when viewing a electronic display screen results in faster tear loss. It is also likely that the higher gaze angle results in a greater percentage of blinks that are incomplete.

Tears are necessary for your overall eye health

ry eye is a condition in which a person doesn't have enough quality tears to lubricate and nourish the eye. About one and half litre tears are made in each eye every day. With every blink, tears are pushed into nose and a fresh lot of tears comes to eye. It is a highly complex functional eco system.

Dry eye is a common and often chronic problem, particularly in older adults.

Major factors:

Age. Dry eyes are a part of the natural aging process. The majority of people over age 65 experience some symptoms of dry eyes.

Gender. Women are more likely to develop dry eyes due to hormonal changes caused by pregnancy, the use of oral contraceptives and menopause.

Medications. Certain medicines, including antihistamines, decongestants, blood pressure medications and antidepressants, can reduce tear production.
